



Rules of the game

The pile of cards is placed in the middle of the table face down.
Each player chooses a counter and stands on the START.
The players roll the dice, the roller with the highest number begins the game.

The first player moves forward according to the number of points on the dice. Next, the player takes the card from the top of the pile and says the sentence with a verb on it.

Depending on the colour of the field, the sentence must be as follows:

- the red field – a negative sentence
- the blue field – a question
- the green field – a positive sentence

The player decides whether to use the Present Simple tense or the Present Continuous tense.

The "key" words help to make a decision.

The player who says the sentence in the wrong tense, misses a turn.

When the player stands on the field with dices – he/she rolls the dice again.

Each player may come across a bad luck or a good luck field and then he/she moves according to the code on the field.

The player who first reaches the FINISH – wins the game.

3. **this week** - Present Continuous e.g. My grandpa is fishing this week.

4. **often** - Present Simple e.g. Do film stars often act live?

5. **every summer** - Present Simple e.g. I don't travel to my lovely aunt every summer.

6. **now** - Present Continuous e.g. People are cooking Asian food now.

7. **at night** - Present Simple e.g. Does your neighbour download music at night?

8. GOOD LUCK! Fly to 21

9. **tomorrow** - Present Continuous e.g. My friends aren't playing tennis tomorrow.

10. **on Wednesdays** - Present Simple e.g. Twins dance hip hop on Wednesdays.

13. **at weekends** - Present Simple e.g. My dad doesn't work at weekends.

14. GOOD LUCK! Fly to 30

15. **every day** - Present Simple e.g. Does your brother study maths every day?

16. **at the moment** - Present Continuous e.g. My sister isn't watering plants at the moment.

17. **usually** - Present Simple e.g. Does your cousin usually vacuum a carpet?

18. **always** - Present Simple e.g. Children don't always listen to their parents.

19. **this evening** - Present Continuous e.g. My grandma is cooking for us this evening.

20. **sometimes** - Present Simple e.g. My uncle sometimes listens to the radio.

22. **this month** - Present Continuous e.g. My family isn't travelling this month.

24. **these days** - Present Continuous e.g. These days actors are working in many theatres.

25. **never** - Present Simple e.g. My pet never eats people's food.

26. **right now** - Present Continuous e.g. Is your family enjoying the time right now?

27. **nowadays** - Present Continuous e.g. Teenagers aren't writing a lot nowadays.

28. **soon** - Present Continuous e.g. My best friend is organizing a party soon.

30. **every holiday** - Present Simple e.g. Her son doesn't cook every holiday.

31. **seldom** - Present Simple e.g. My relative seldom visits me.

32. **at present** - Present Simple e.g. Is your idol greeting new fans at present?

33. **on weekdays** - Present Simple e.g. Farmers don't tidy their homes on weekdays.

35. **hardly ever** - Present Simple e.g. Cooks hardly ever clean the pots.
